





About Us

We are a Christian charity working in the Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead. By supporting organisations assisting local people suffering ill-health, poverty, mental or physical distress or who are under-privileged in some way, we seek to promote higher standards of moral life.

In 2011, we gave over £8,500 to:

All Saints Church: to support the community of Larchfield to benefit over 50 children.

Churches Together in Windsor: to support their homelessness project.

Jubilee Church: to support the running of their Vibe Youth Club.

Thames Hospicecare: to provide practical and emotional support for patients and carers in their own home.

Berkshire East & South Bucks Women's Aid: to fund an external Clinical Psychologist to undertake mental health assessments of new women who move into refuge houses.

In 2012 and beyond, we look forward to helping you:

We may be able to help you financially if your group is providing assistance to people living within the Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead who are suffering ill-health, poverty, mental or physical distress or who are generally under-privileged or disabled. We support voluntary work in education, social service and similar charitable activities, and the development of higher standards of moral life in our community,

How much can you apply for?

We usually do not make grants of more than about £2,000. And we do not usually help an organisation in successive years.

To help your financial planning, we may be able to spread the grant over two or three years.

When should you apply?

We make two distributions a year: in the spring and the autumn. For our spring distribution, we need your application by the end of March; and for the autumn, by the end of September.
